SCRIPTURE: (<u>https://lectionary.library.vanderbilt.edu/texts.php?id=71</u>, adapted for our bearing): Acts 10:44-48 (CEB) Sue

While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell on everyone who heard the word. The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles. They heard them speaking in other languages and praising God. Peter asked, "These people have received the Holy Spirit just as we have. Surely no one can stop them from being baptized with water, can they?" He directed that they be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited Peter to stay for several days.

Psalm 98, (CEB, adapted for our hearing) Sue Sing to the Lord a new song because the Lord has done wonderful things! The Lord's own strong hand and the Lord's own holy arm have won the victory! The Lord has made salvation widely known; the Lord has revealed his righteousness in the eyes of all the nations. God has remembered God's loval love and faithfulness to the house of Israel; every corner of the earth has seen our God's salvation. Shout triumphantly to the Lord, all the earth! Be happy! Rejoice out loud! Sing your praises! Sing your praises to the Lord with the lyre with the lyre and the sound of music. With trumpets and a horn blast, shout triumphantly before the Lord, the king! Let the sea and everything in it roar;

the world and all its inhabitants too.

Let all the rivers clap their hands;

let the mountains rejoice out loud altogether before the Lord because the Lord is coming to establish justice on the Earth! The Lord will establish justice in the world rightly; the Lord will establish justice among all people fairly.

John 15: 9-17 (CEB, adapted for our hearing)

"As the Father loved me, I too have loved you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I kept my Father's commandments and remain in God's love. I have said these things to you so that my joy will be in you and your joy will be complete. This is my commandment: love each other just as I have loved you. No one has greater love than to give up one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I don't call you servants any longer, because servants don't know what their master is doing. Instead, I call you friends, because everything I heard from my Father I have made known to you. You didn't choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you could go and produce fruit and so that your fruit could last. As a result, whatever you ask the Father in my name, God will give you. I give you these commandments so that you can love each other.
